



Sailing Instructions (SI)

2024 Swedish Championship Nordic Folkboat

Dates: August 14-18

Location: Lake Vättern, Karlsborg Sweden

Class: Nordic Folkboat

Organizing authority: Carlsborgs sailing association (CSS)

1. Rules

1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

2. Changes to the Sailing Instructions

- 2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the official notice board at <https://www.sailarena.com/sv/se/club/css/sm-folkbat/> before 08:00 on the day it will take effect.
- 2.2 Any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20:00 on the day before it will take effect.

3. Signals made ashore

- 3.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flag pole located outside the clubhouse
- 3.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in RRS Race Signals.

5. The start



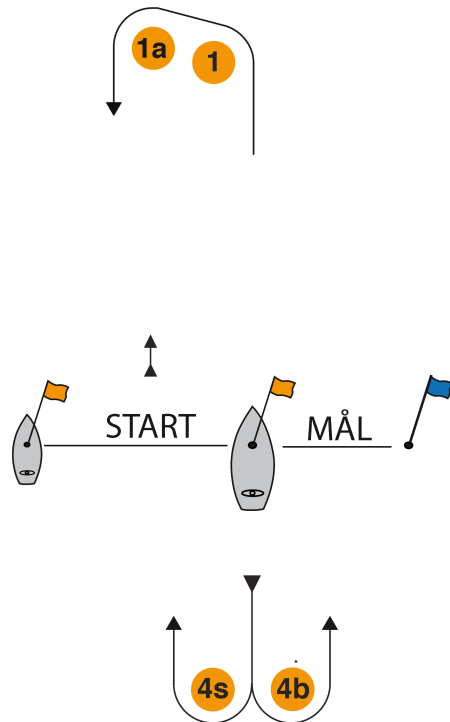
5:1 Warning signal will be flag F

5:2 To alert boats that a new starting sequence is about to begin, the orange flag on the starting line will be displayed with a sound signal not less than five minutes before the attention signal.

5:3 A boat that does not start within five minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

6. The course

- 6.1 The starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark.
- 6.2 The diagram below shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side of which each mark is to be left.



The course is to be sailed

Start –1–1a – 4s/4b – 1–1a – 4s/4b – finish.

Marks 1, 4S and 4b will be yellow cylindrical inflatable buoys (fat type).

Mark 1a will be a yellow cylindrical inflatable buoy (narrow type).

- 6.3 The finish line is between a staff displaying a blue flag on the Race Committee vessel and a blue flag buoy
- 6.4 The race committee will try to set the course so that a race will take approximately 60 min for the first boat.
- 6.5 The time limit for the first boat to sail the course is 120 min.
- 6.6 A boat that does not finish within 30 min after the first boat has finished, will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF). This changes RRS 35.

7. Protests and requests for hearings

- 7.1 Protests and requests for hearings shall be filed at the race office within the protest time limit and comply with the requirements of RRS 61.2.
- 7.2 The time limit for protest is 50 minutes and is calculated from the time the boats had a reasonable opportunity to sail in from the track and moor.
- 7.3 Notices will be posted no later than 15 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses, including time and place for the hearing.
