



Sailing Instructions (SI)

Event: Swedish Championship for 606

Date: 9th – 11th August 2024

Location: Gävle - Sweden

Level of

competition: RED Boatclass: 606

1. Rules

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 RRS 44.1 is changed so the two turns penalty is replaced by one turn

2. Changes to the Sailing Instructions

- 2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the official notice board at Annexet (a green building in harbour area) before 08:00 on the day it will take effect. The messages is also posted on notice board at Sailarena.
- 2.2 Any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20:00 on the day before it will take effect. The messages is also posted on noticeboard at Sailarena.

3. Signals made ashore

- 3.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flag pole closest to building Annexet.
- 3.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in RRS Race Signals.



4. The start

4.2 Warning signal will be flag E




- 4.3 RRS 26 starting procedure applies.
- 4.4 To alert boats that a starting sequence is about to begin, the orange flag on the starting line will be displayed on the committee boat with a sound signal not less than five minutes before the warning signal.
- 4.5 A boat that does not start within ten minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.



5. The course

- 5.1 The starting line is between a pole with an orange flag on the committee boat and a buoy with a pole with an orange flag.
- 5.2 The finishing line will be between a blue flag on the committee boat and a buoy with a pole with a blue flag.
- 5.3 The diagram below shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side of which each mark is to be left.



The course is to be sailed: START - 1s/1b - 2s/2b - 1s/1b - 2s/2b - Finish.

Important information!

If the number flag 1 is displayed in connection with the start, the course must be sailed three laps. (2+1)

- 5.4 The marks will be yellow cylindrical buoys.
- 5.5 The race committee will try to set the course so that a race will take approximately 45 minutes for the first boat.
- 5.6 The time limit for the first boat to sail the course is 90 minutes
- 5.7 A boat that does not finish within 20 minutes after the first boat has finished, will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF). This changes RRS 35.

6. Protests and requests for hearings

- 6.1 Protests and requests for hearings shall be filed at the race office at the club house within the protest time limit and comply with the requirements of RRS 61.2. Appendix T1 will apply.
- 6.2 The time limit for protest is 50 minutes and is calculated from the time the boats had a reasonable opportunity to sail in from the track and moor. This changes the App. S 13.2
- 6.3 Notices will be posted on the official notice board, at the house Annexet, no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses, including time and place for the hearing. The messages will also be posted on noticeboard on Sailarena.
